







CRAFTING TIP

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### Used items:

<b>22 672 606</b>	Set metal decorative ring, flat	1 pack
<b>89 812 570</b>	Waxed cord with nylon core, Ø 0.6 mm	5.80 metres
<b>22 000 22</b>	Metal bead, Ø 6 mm	9 piece
<b>22 001 22</b>	Metal bead, Ø 8 mm	4 piece
<b>22 245 21</b>	Ringlet Ø 7 mm	9 piece
<b>22 665 607</b>	Metal pendant feather	2 piece
<b>22 398 21</b>	Connector for leather straps, Ø 2 mm	6 piece
<b>85 463 102</b>	Feathers cut	6 piece
<b>22 573 606</b>	Metal linked chain with clasp, Ø 2 mm	1 piece

### Additionally, you will need:

<b>33 397 00</b>	Jewellery glue	<b>69 067 000</b>	Blunt tapestry needles
<b>89 378 00</b>	A pair of scissors	<b>89 341 00</b>	A pair of flat-nosed pliers

### Instructions:

Start by sticking each of the 6 feathers into a connector for the leather straps, using a little bit of jewellery glue, and let them harden. Now cut the cord as follows: 2.20 metres for the large ring, 3 × 0.90 metres for the small rings and 3 × 0.30 metres for the connections of the rings.

Start with a small ring.

**1** To start, take 1 cm of cord, hold it onto the ring and then wrap the rest of the cord around it.

**2** Once the cord has been wrapped completely around the whole ring, take the end of the cord, thread it into a tapestry needle and make the first loop. Make 3 more loops with a distance of 0.5 cm (small ring) (1.3 cm large ring). The 4rd loop should be located opposite the first.

**3** Now, apply 2 loops at the same position as the loops on the opposite side. In a final step, make a loop on the left, next to the first. Start the 2nd row in the middle. For this, please look at the illustration.

**4** Working consecutively, now complete all the loops. (In the large ring, make a 3rd row).

**5** Now thread on a little metal bead (large bead in the large ring) and sew on 2 to 3 times, as illustrated. When done, apply a little bit of jewellery glue to the cord, just before the bead, pull it through, and then cut off the cord. Do the same with the remaining small rings, and with the large ring, pay attention regarding the larger distances and having the 3rd row in the middle.

Using an overhand knot, now tie 3 × 30 cm cord to the right, left and centre of the large ring, with the centre being at the bottom of the ring. The thread ends should all have the same length, approx. 13 cm. On the left, in each case, thread a small and large metal bead onto both threads, on one thread, thread on a completed ring and a small metal bead. Connect both threads with an overhand knot, apply a little bit of jewellery glue to the knots and then cut off the rest. Slide the knots into the large metal bead. Complete the right and the centre in the same way.

In closing, with the help of a pair of flat-nosed pliers, use a ringlet to connect the cut feathers to the 3 small rings. Hook in the two metal feathers and the anchor chain to the large ring.

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
